NEWS BRIEFS

The Project has been very active since the last Information Bulletin in December 1976. This number summarizes only highlights of the past six months. Activities by staff members will be reported in a later Bulletin.

The German Russian Project is a co-sponsor with the Colorado Humanities Program and various civic and educational groups of a unique program in Brighton, Colorado, making a comparative study of the immigrant experience of four ethnic groups in the Brighton area--German Russians, Chicanos, Japanese, and Anglos. Albin Wagner is director of the Project.

The Project is sponsoring a visit to Colorado State University by the leading authority on the South American German Russians, Dr. Iris B. Graefe of the Austrian Academy of Sciences. She will present a lecture on June 29, "The German Russians in Argentina Revisited," conduct research in the Special Collection, and visit historic sites.

A scholarship program has been established at Colorado State University to encourage study of the history and culture of the Colorado German Russians. The fund was initiated by the Denver-Metro Chapter of the AHSGR during a ceremony at CSU, in which Miss Donna Hamburg was honored for her work on the German Russians of Mead, Colorado.

A new interdisciplinary course, "Immigration Studies: Colorado's German Russians" will be offered in the Department of History next spring semester.

In addition to ongoing research, publication, and oral history interviewing by staff members, the Special Collection in the CSU Libraries continues to grow in size and scope. Presently the Collection numbers more than 700 titles comprising over 800 items. An index to the Collection will be published in the coming year in a planned volume of essays on the German Russians of Colorado. Watch for later announcements. John Newman, Project Archivist, requests that because of increased interest and use of the Special Collection, off-campus researchers should contact him to arrange in advance for access.

The publication program of the Project continues with a new volume in the "Monographs, Papers, and Reports" Series--My Prairie Childhood, by Clara Hilderman Ehrlich. A second printing of Kenneth W. Rock, Germans from Russia in America: The First Hundred Years, and of James W. Long, Russian Language Sources Relating to the Germans from Russia has been issued see reverse side for announcements of these three items). In progress are a volume of essays on Colorado's German Russians and a bibliographical guide to research materials.



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
